And in a prolonged dialogue with the Jews, Jesus leans in with pointed words about this deliberate detractor of the Christian faith and his influence with humanity.

	Entirely different marching orders have been assigned to believers: your So, while darkness hates the light, light is called to love those in darkness.
4 <u>D</u>	(8:43)
	Scorning the of Life, they had little concern for His of life.
	No wonder that His words did not find reception with them due to their rejection of Him.
	In a day and age where today Christians are called intolerant, the exact opposite is actually true.

CONCLUSION

Two challenges surface from this passage. First, make sure you know who your real spiritual father is? Only two options exist. And second, who are you sharing the good news with? How will they believe if they aren't hearing the gospel? And how will they hear the gospel if we aren't speaking the gospel? Verbalize the One who is the way, the truth, and the life. It truly is a matter of life or death.
